Drawing on the key insights highlighted by this research, we have developed recommendations to help local government organisations maximise the value of their digital transformation.

1. Create a digital vision

Cloud is not an end in itself, but a pathway to innovative citizen services, offering engaging user experiences, improving team satisfaction, boosting productivity and lowering costs. But to ensure your transformation is far-reaching and sustainable, you'll need a clear strategy and vision.

2. Skill up for digital

Working in the cloud requires new technical skills and an understanding of the complexities. To meet the challenges of supporting innovation in the cloud – and the growing digital skills gap – it's more important than ever to invest in the right resources, skillsets and experience.

3. Collaborate for success

Do you and your service units share the same transformation goals? Are you able to work effectively towards a common goal? Digital transformation is complex and challenging – and it needs to be a team effort. We look at the importance of building a successful partnership to fully embrace the modernising potential of cloud.

4. Governance – controlling costs and standards

By its nature, cloud enables more agile, collaborative ways of working, where innovation can come from anywhere across the organisation. But increased fragmentation can lead to new vulnerabilities in terms of uncontrolled access, lack of compliance and cloud overspend. We look at how you can rein in the risk by focusing on governance.

5. Create an innovation mindset

The ultimate goal of cloud migration is around fully enabling your transformational potential. Once the foundations are in place, the challenge is to build the foundations for continuous innovation. We look at how to make use of your new digital capabilities and find new ways of creating value, increasing efficiencies and delivering outstanding citizen services and experiences – well into the future.
